Digital Education Action Plan 2018

- o **Adopted** in January 2018, as part of initiatives supporting the creation of European Education Area.
- Scope: primary, secondary and tertiary levels of formal education
- Focused approach: Eleven actions across three priorities:

Priority 1 Making better use of digital technology for teaching and learning Priority 2 Priority 3 Improving education through better data analysis and foresight

o **Duration** until the end of 2020



Digital Education Action Plan **Update**: lessons learned and guiding principles

- More strategic and ambitious approach to digital education
- Continuity due to high relevance of current three priorities
- Wider scope, expanding beyond formal education to non-formal and lifelong learning
- Longer duration until 2027
- Reinforced funding measures
- Stronger engagement with stakeholders
- Maximised communication opportunities



Digital Education Action Plan Update

- Update to build on the three core priorities
- Key areas of focus:
 - Promoting digital literacy and closing the digital skills gap
 - Fighting disinformation and online threats;
 - Developing digital capabilities in education organisations;
 - Making digital learning a reality for all (online learning and high-quality online content);
 - Addressing inclusion, gender digital gap;
 - Harvesting (big) data, predictive analytics and strategic foresight
- A limited number of ambitious new actions and upscaling of actions from the 2018 Action Plan.
